The California Municipal Utilities Association (CMUA) is composed of more than 60 community-owned electric, water and gas utilities in California. Founded in 1932, CMUA represents its members before the California Legislature and regulatory agencies. CMUA members provide a quarter of the states' total electricity needs and over 85% of states' water needs. Community-owned utilities contribute to California's requirement to meet 50% of the states' electricity needs through renewable power by 2030.

A community-owned utility is an electric, water, or gas provider operated by a local municipal government or special district. Water and electric utilities can deliver services to both retail customers and or/wholesale customers. Utility practices and rates are overseen by locally elected board members or elected municipal officials. Because community-owned utilities are owned by the people of the local community their elected boards members and/or City Councils are more responsive to the needs of their customers.

Community-owned utilities do not operate for profit and their rates are generally significantly lower than those of privately-owned or investor-owed utilities such as PG&E.
