Job Announcement Regulatory Manager for Energy

Position Summary

The California Municipal Utilities Association (CMUA) is seeking to hire a full-time **Regulatory Manager for Energy** to represent and advocate on energy issues, including their environmental and climate-change impacts, before California regulatory and administrative agencies. This individual will coordinate and collaborate with CMUA member electric utilities and water agencies (on energy issues) to develop consensus positions on regulatory issues, and represent and promote these positions to the appropriate regulatory and administrative agencies, Governor's Office, other stakeholders, and interest groups. This position will focus on energy-related issues affecting publicly-owned electric utilities and the environmental impacts of those issues. Additional experience with water regulatory issues is a plus. The Regulatory Manager for Energy is expected to grow to be a senior policy strategist for publicly owned utilities in California, promoting CMUA as an industry thought leader. The agencies that the Regulatory Manager for Energy will work with include: California Air Resources Board; California Energy Commission; California Public Utilities Commission; California Independent System Operator; State water agencies; Governor's Office; and to a lesser extent, federal agencies including the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, U.S. EPA and U.S. DOE. The Manager will also coordinate and work closely with contracted legal support as well as CMUA's Legislative Director for Energy on these issues. This position requires registration as a regulatory advocate (lobbyist).

Essential Functions and Duties

- Identify, track, analyze, monitor, and report on energy-related and environmental regulatory issues/proceedings.
- Work closely and coordinate with CMUA's Legislative Director for Energy, and assist with legislative analysis, as needed.
- Ability to coordinate and collaborate with diverse CMUA members in developing and communicating CMUA's position and strategy on regulatory proceedings and issues.
- Must be a team player in a highly collaborative environment.
- Demonstrated ability to get access to regulatory and administrative agency decision-makers and staff. Should be able to get insider information from individuals in these agencies.
- Engage members of the CMUA Regulatory Committee and other related groups in the evaluation and positioning of regulatory issues.
- Contribute to the CMUA strategic issues workshop to prioritize regulatory and legislative issues that impact members.
- Able to function well in a matrix management environment.



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- Must be well-organized, with demonstrated ability to plan appropriately to meet deadlines.
- Design effective regulatory training programs, both for CMUA members and State regulators.
- Promote the members' regulatory positions and strategies to the Governor's Office, regulatory and administrative agencies, other stakeholders, and interest groups.
- Build coalitions and/or common positions with other stakeholders and interest groups.
- Testify before regulatory and administrative proceedings, hearings, and meetings. Must be a good public speaker and excellent writer.
- Develop presentations, educational materials, talk sheets, regulatory comments and other materials for association advocacy, as appropriate.
- Perform related duties as assigned. Able to travel regularly for business.

Education, Training and Experience

BA/BS Degree in Science, Engineering, Political Science, Public Policy, Business, or other related field. Candidate should have a minimum 5 years' experience working on energy and environmental regulatory issues in California with regulatory and administrative agencies. Experience in an advocacy role is preferred, as well as an understanding of the role of an advocate. Additional experience working on water regulatory issues in California with regulatory and administrative agencies is desirable but not mandatory. Experience working on legislative issues and legislation is a plus. Salary is commensurate with experience; full benefits provided. CMUA is a member of the California Public Employees Retirement system and provides retirement, medical, and other benefits similar to that provided to state and local government employees.
